



Conclusions

A return to grassroots funding and local investment has been echoed in calls for the adoption of philanthrolocalism which "posits the primary purpose of philanthropy ought to be to increase opportunities for and strengthen the possibilities of authentic human communion" (Beer 2015, 99).

CENTRAL CONCLUSIONS CITIATION Catalyzing crises pushing resistant organizations towards change, stumbling block of organizational path dependency (Tilcsik and Marquis 2013, 137) Investments in partnerships and collaborations grow during crisis as a (Murray 2013) springboard for strengthening community networks of practice and multiplying investment potential Crises have the potential to enable further "gap-filling" for lax social safety nets by (Morvaridi 2015, 1) unelected, non-transparent private investment in public goods
